



# COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

April 26, 2022

The Town of Didsbury Council held a Regular Council Meeting on Tuesday April 26, 2022, in Council Chambers, 1606 – 14 Street.

- The CAO Report was extensive and included many first quarter reports from various departments. Council specifically mentioned the report and information provided by the Economic Development Officer and highlighted the new promotional brochure.
- Council approved the amendment of 2022 Capital Budget that will see an overall increase of \$890,000, as a result of the \$200,000 increase for 15<sup>th</sup> Ave. to 17<sup>th</sup> Ave. as well as the \$690,000 for 17<sup>th</sup> Ave. to 18<sup>th</sup> Ave., which was originally scheduled to be done in 2023. The decrease will be recognized in the following year (2023) with the removal of the allocated \$796,000 for 17<sup>th</sup> Ave. to 18<sup>th</sup> Ave.
- Mayor Hunter was formally appointed to the Central Alberta Mayors and Reeves Caucus. Meetings have been paused since the pandemic and will resume quarterly starting in May.
