



COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

June 11, 2026

The Town of Didsbury Council held a Regular Council Meeting on Tuesday, June 11, 2026 in Council Chambers.

Rosebud Health Foundation

The Rosebud Health Foundation Chairperson, Peggy Good, and Treasurer, Leo Dussault, provided an introduction to Council on the Foundation and outlined its role in Didsbury.

E3 Lithium

Leigh Clarke, VP, Government & Stakeholder Engagement from E3 Lithium presented information regarding E3's upcoming project in Mountain View County and provided insights regarding project impacts to the community.

Bylaws & Policies

FIN 004-26 Payment Authority Policy

Council approved updates to the Payment Authority Policy to include authority over Internal Bank Transfers.

Privacy Management Plan

Council adopted the Didsbury Privacy Management Plan, as presented, and a digital copy of the PMP will be posted to the town website for public access.

Alberta municipalities must have a Privacy Management Program (PMP) under the Protection of Privacy Act (POPA). This mandatory program establishes documented policies, procedures, and tools to ensure personal information is handled lawfully, protected with reasonable security, and that the public's privacy rights are proactively respected.

Butte Reservoir – Emergency Backup Generator

Council approved the installation of a backup generator at the Butte Reservoir for \$127,000, funded from the Water Reserve.

With the East Reservoir nearing completion, the Butte emergency power backup is a necessity. To work with one set of operating conditions, the Butte will need to maintain power at all times to ensure the two reservoirs work as one.

Pickleball Project Proposal

Council appointed Councillors Curt Engel, Irwin Mahon, and Troy Lambert to a Community Partnership Project Ad Hoc Committee to make a recommendation to Council on a proposed pickleball court project.

Golf Course Sanitary Sewer Connection

Council approved an amendment to the 2026 Capital Budget to add \$105,000 to the Golf Course Sanitary Sewer Connection project for a total project cost of \$245,000, to be funded from the Strategic Initiative and Contingency Reserve, and proceed with the construction of a new gravity main connecting the clubhouse to the Town of Didsbury sanitary collection network.
